- 2. Enable clear recognition for farms, companies, and organisations across the agricultural industry who champion fair and appropriate data rights, leading the industry forward**

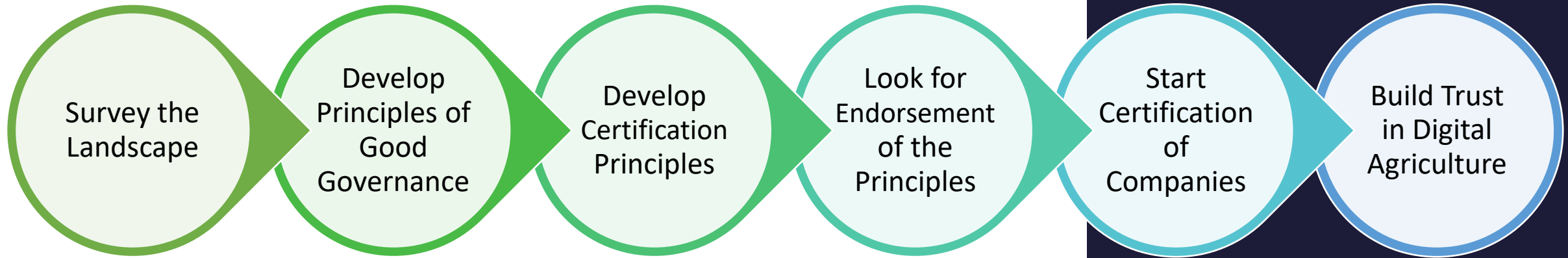
Why are we having this conversation?



- We are not unleashing the value of data as a sector
- Broad agreement we need to take farm data governance more seriously
- Approaches are fragmented, non-standard, with little or no safeguards
- Lacking trust & confidentiality: agrifood is wary of data participation

- **NEED a clear trusted standard set by a voluntary 'gold standard'**
- **NEED some action in this space to progress the sector**

Our Process



Our short term actions

- Survey of what work has been done on farm data governance nationally and internationally
- Understand “what good looks like”, and shape and disseminate the gold standard ambition for UK farm data standards, underpinning good governance
- Develop, share, and award certification against this gold standard
- Promote those organisations which meet the standards as examples, to build trust and to keep raising industry expectations

Principles for good farm data governance



YOUR DATA IS YOUR DATA

- ✓ The Data Originator, normally the farmer, owns and controls the data
- ✓ The Data Originator can access, edit, delete, and migrate data easily
- ✓ Data is not accessed or store data without explicit opt-in permission
- ✓ Data is not shared or sold without explicit opt-in permission
- ✓ There is clarity as to what parties are involved processing the data and why



WE ARE CLEAR ABOUT THE VALUE AND BENEFIT OF DATA SHARING

- ✓ Value will sometimes be monetary, and other times will be actionable insights
- ✓ There is clear explanation from the outset regarding what raw data is used and how; and where value is generated, it is clear what that value is and who benefits
- ✓ We clearly explain how we aggregate data, and what value it generates, and to whom



WE KEEP YOUR DATA SAFE

- ✓ The security of users' data is essential
- ✓ Appropriate data security standards for an organisation's activities are adopted, and there is a clear explanation of why it is appropriate.
- ✓ There are processes in place to maintain security of users' data in the unlikely event of a data breach



WE STRIVE TO MAKE DATA EASY

- ✓ Simple naming conventions are adopted and common across the organisation's tools
- ✓ Organisations strive to allow systems to talk to each other, and to support other organisations and systems to share data using best practice and conventions
- ✓ There is a proactive approach to providing training on data and data use, appropriate to the organisation's data users
- ✓ The organisation is accessible and responsive to requests, instructions, or complaints

Farm Data Principles – the new name



- The British Farm Data Council has recently incorporated as *Farm Data Principles Ltd*, an independent not-for-profit company, and will transition to calling itself *Farm Data Principles* in the near future.
- We are in the process of applying for a certification mark.



Certification

- ✓ A register of those who sign up to the principles will be published.
- ✓ Self-declaration is required. A fee of £950 will be payable, and a questionnaire will be completed, signing up to the principles.

Certification by Communagator Ltd

- Communagator, led by Julian Gairdner, acts as the Operator contracted to Farm Data Principles Limited
 - Help to promote and raise awareness of the scheme
 - Review applications and facilitate certification process, including general guidance and support for applicant organisations
 - Oversee the certification process of the scheme
 - Carry out the initial handling of complaints and disputes
