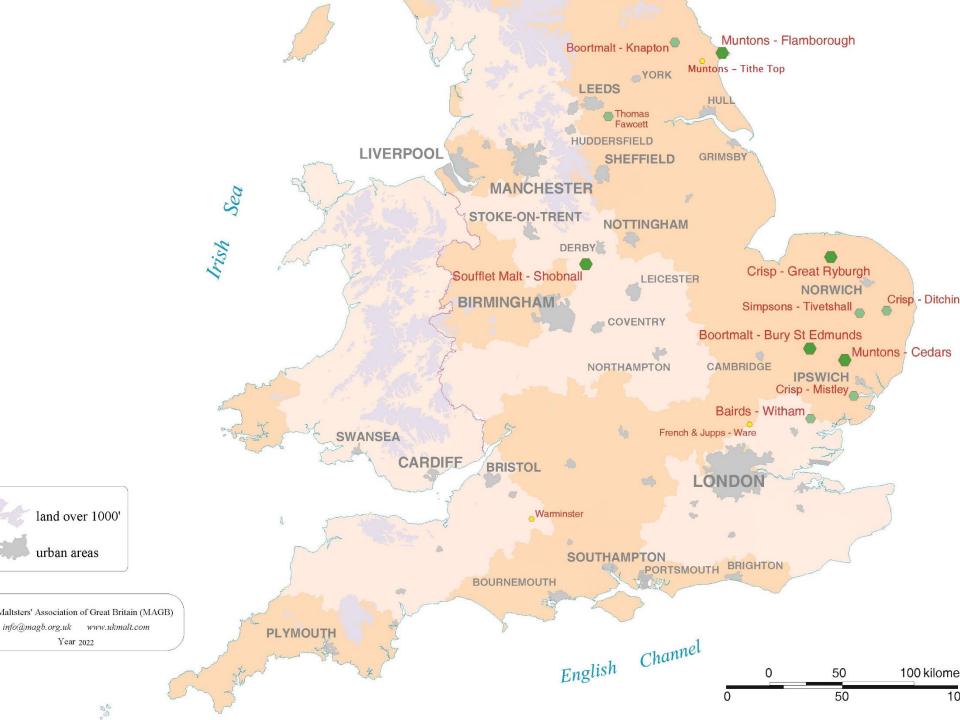

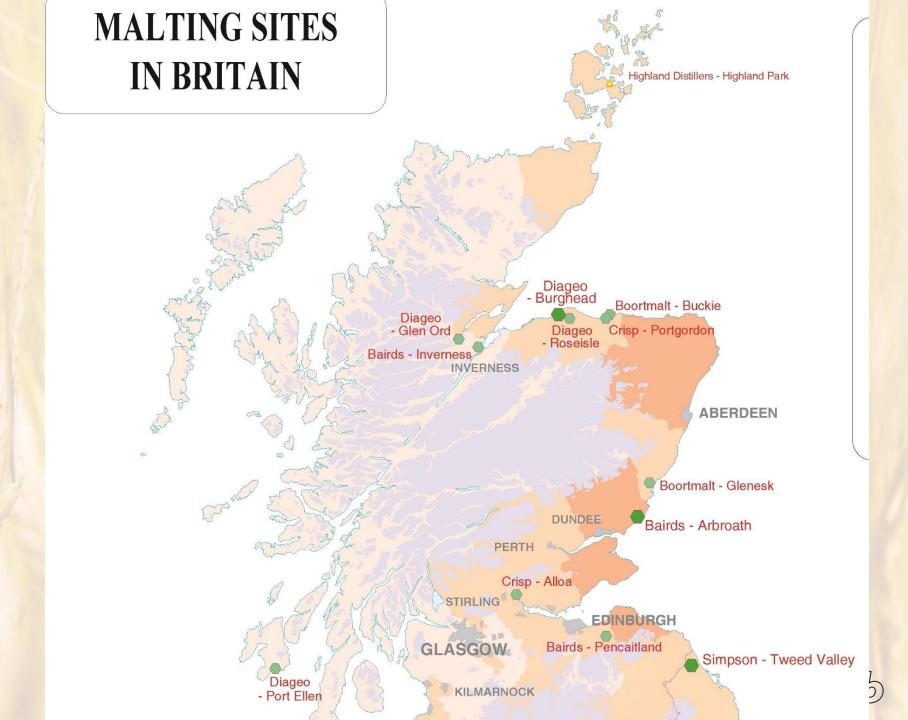


UK malting industry

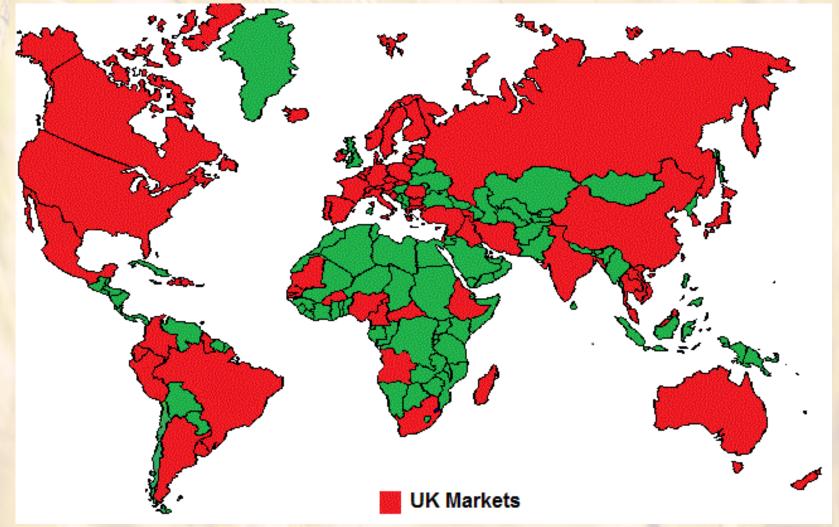
- 18 malting companies
- 36 production sites
- Utilise 2+ million tonnes malting barley
- Produce 1.6 million tonnes malt
- Customers are whisky distillers (53%), brewers (31%), export (11%) and food (5%).

Adding value to the supply chain

Malt

1 hectare yields 7 tonnes barley

Barley

Value **£2,100**

7 tonnes barley gives 5.6 tonnes malt

Value £3,920

5.6 tonnes malt gives 87,000 pints of beer <u>or</u> 6,600 bottles of malt whisky

Whisky

Value £348,000 (beer) and £231,000 (whisky)
